UTILITIES: Oltmans updated the Council on the purchase price of \$162,308 for additional natural gas capacity on Northern Natural Gas's transmission pipeline and presented the Precedent Agreement West Leg 2024 Expansion Between Northern Natural Gas and Alton Municipal Utilities.

Motion by Plathe and second by Mulder to approve the Precedent Agreement West Leg 2024 Expansion Between Northern Natural Gas and Alton Municipal Utilities. Ayes 4

TREES: The Council discussed the effects emerald ash borer is having on the trees in town and the City's responsibility to remove affected trees in the ROW.

Mulder informed the Council that Alton Reformed Church has groups that are looking for community service projects in town possibly assisting with tree removal. The Council discussed having these groups assist the City in documenting any trees in town that are out of compliance with the tree ordinance.

LAND PURCHASE: MOC/FV has contacted the City regarding the practice field by the Alton city pool and park. MOC/FV would like to give the City the first opportunity to purchase the field if interested. The Council discussed purchase price and potential future use.

Motion by Mulder and second by Krull to purchase MOC/FV practice field for \$25,340. Ayes 4

EQUIPMENT: Oltmans presented quotes from Mouw Motor and Ver Hoef Automotive for the purchase of a new pickup to replace the 2011 Chevy Silverado. The council discussed the quotes, and the amount budgeted for a new pickup.
