HABITAT FOR HUMANITY: Kurt Franje from Habitat for Humanity contacted Oltmans notifying him that Habitat for Humanity has an opportunity to apply for a Workforce Housing Tax Credit for housing. He asked if the City would be interested in another Habitat for Humanity home in Alton and if the City had a lot available.

The Council discussed the lots in Hiemstra Addition which the City purchased with LMI money. The Council discussed if the new Habitat for Humanity home would fall within guidelines of the LMI requirements and if there was interest in the City assisting with another Habitat for Humanity home.

Motion by Mulder and second by Plathe to have Oltmans send a letter of intent to commit selling Lot 3 in Hiemstra Addition to Habitat for Humanity for \$1.00 and contingent upon receiving the housing grant. Ayes 3
