Gutierrez/Castaneda have cleaned up some of the junk around the properties they own but are requesting more time to meet code. Gutierrez/Castaneda have listed eight properties with a realtor. The ninth property that was previously under consideration does not show a clear title to Gutierrez/Castaneda. Currently two properties have tenants and one of those tenants has been served a 30-day notice.
